Sister Anna Marie Weinreis, PBVM, served as professor of French and Academic Dean at Presentation College for many years. In addition to her teaching, Sister Weinreis wrote poetry that was published in "Pasque Petals", and in her books titled "Sips of Wein" and "Vintage Wein". She also presented history papers at the annual Dakota Conferences, served as advisor for the college newspaper, directed the college plays and wrote a weekly newspaper column called "Draughts from the Wein Cellar". Sister Weinreis received numerous honors for her work throughout her career.

Southeast Building Fall 2017 Grand Opening of Restored Gallery

- ♣ Built-in display case 6'H x 17'W x 21"D
- ♣ Three sections of 6'H x 5'6"W x 21"D * Divider walls
- ♣ Allows for three exhibits at the same time
- ♣ Some exhibits will display throughout the entire width of the case. Divider walls are removable.
- Artisans from South Dakota and the Midwest will be invited to show their varied art media.
- ♣ Two month shows * One month high school and college student shows
- ♣ Pieces should be delivered ready to hang on slatwall or be displayed on acrylic shelves, and easels. Divider walls have slatwall on both sides for additional artwork.
- **Lach** section is locked to protect the artwork.
- Motion sensor LED lighting will provide illumination for shorter periods of time, thus protecting the exhibit. Each section has directional and dimmable lighting.
- Security cameras will monitor the Gallery and surrounding area.
- Exhibits will be advertised.

Presentation College will provide:

- 1. Space for the exhibit: Slatwall backdrop, acrylic shelving and easels, and pedestals.
- 2. Publicity- a press release will be written for the exhibition in the Aberdeen News and the artist's local newspaper. The exhibit will be mentioned on the Presentation College and local fb pages.
- 3. Installation assistance arranged with the Gallery Coordinator.
- 4. An opportunity for sales. It is up to the artist to arrange prices with the purchaser. Any purchasing inquiries will be forwarded to the exhibitor. Presentation College does not charge any commission fee for art works sold.

Presentation College is **not responsible** for damage or theft of the art.

The Exhibitor will provide:

- Copies of the following to the Gallery Coordinator at least three weeks before the exhibit has begun: Artist statement, Biography, a copy of an inventory sheet listing title, size, media, and price. Packing, shipping and insurance costs to and from the exhibition site, unless previously arranged between exhibitor and Presentation College, will be incurred by the exhibitor.
- 2. Artwork, ready to install, to fill the display case section. Artwork included in the exhibition must not drastically differ stylistically from the contract description.
- 3. Presentation College has the right to reproduce artwork for publicity purposes such as brochures, postcards, newsletters, advertising, etc.
